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Today is a fantastic day for me. My installation has taken place on the first day of Diwali, Dhanteras.
Being Diwali, I was wondering if all of you would come
and attend the installation. However by coming for this
function, you have demonstrated that you all love me very
much, and that the power of love outweighs all other forces
in life.

The story of my life begins with My father—my role model who was a fantastic public health personality, Harvard educated, Magna cum Laude, Padma Shree, and a dedicated professor at KEM Hospital. When I finished my MBBS, I wanted to go into public health, but my father told me, "Hrishi, it's a difficult line, people don't respect me so much, so why don't you opt for Gynaecology, which is a blend of medicine, surgery, mental health, and above all, the only field where you could treat two individuals simultaneously!!" I agreed to my father's suggestion and became a gynecologist. Today I stand before you as President Of the Federation, a vehicle that enables me to commit myself to public health. AQ3

The last three decades have been excellent for the field, with numerous breakthroughs such as ultrasound, endoscopy, and IVF. In 1984, when I was working in KEM as Dr. ND Motashaw's house surgeon, the first hysteroscopic workshop in India was conducted. My boss was the late, Dr. Raval, who was a fantastic human being. He was one of the pioneers in obstetric ultrasounds in the country. He asked me to join him as an ICMR fellow. During this time I did many thousands of obstetric ultrasounds. Then came the fantastic line of IVF, and I was smitten by it; eventually, I took that line, and there was no turning back. Simultaneously, there has been a lot of public health movement in the last 30 years, which has been defined by UN SDGs goals. Women's life expectancy in India has increased from 49.7 (1975) to 70.7 (2022). Author Yuval Harari, in his book Homo Deus proposes that as science advances, our longevity will increase, and women may live to be 150 years old and remarry at the age of 75!! It is a fresh start.

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Once, when I was travelling to Coimbatore for an IVF 45 cycle and was waiting in the lounge for the plane, I was 46 admiring twins bothering their mother and felt bad for 47 her; and then, a woman came and touched my feet and I 48 was surprised when she said, "Dr. Pai, I was treated by you 49 and received these twins from you"; the immense gratitude 50 I got from my patient was phenomenal, and the same grati-51 tude I am experiencing today for all of you. I would also 52 like to express my gratitude to my parents and thank them, 53 my great mother and father, Mrs. Hema and Dr. Dutta Pai, 54 were my teachers; my father was a freedom fighter who was 55 imprisoned for four years, and I greatly admire and respect 56 him. Thanks to my wife, Dr. Rishma Pai, former president of 57 the federation and a wonderful human being. My children, 58 Anvisha and Dr. Arnav Pai, as well as the new addition to 59 the family, Ravi, are doing well by the grace of God. Arnav 60



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is studying gynecology and Anvisha is studying IT. Poonam
Dhillon, my sister-in-law, is a wonderful person with a
golden heart, and her two children, Paloma and Anmol,
are both aspiring actors. My sister Medha and her husband,
Dr. Upendra Kulkarni, a gynecologist, have traveled all
the way from the USA. I also recall my aunts Kamal and

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Mrinal. Dr. Nandita Palshetkar and Dr. Rohan Palshetkar, 67 my IVF business partners and friends, I thank you. I would 68 also like to thank my dear friend Dr. Dinesh Salgaonkar, 69 Ms. Ojaswini Kapoor, Dr. Shaunak Khandwala, Dr. Pooja 70 Mehta, Dr. Sunita Arora, Mr. Ashok Ghandat, Dr. Sudesh 71 Kamat, Dr. Shailendra Mahimkar, Ms. Vrunda Kuchekar, 72 Dr. Parul Sharma, Mr. Nikhil Banwat and all members of 73 my bloom IVF family. I could not have achieved all this if I 74 had not been a member of the Mumbai OBGYN society; I 75 will never forget them because everything I am today is due 76 to the Mumbai society. I thank the entire FOGSI leadership, 77 including past presidents and the secretary general. Thank 78 you to all the government agencies. International officials 79 Dr. Anne Kihara from FIGO, Dame Lesley Regan from 80 FIGO, Dr. Rohana Haththotuwa from SAFOG, and Dr. Fer-81 dousi Begum from SAFOG. The most important two people 82 in my life today are President Dr. S Shantha Kumari and 83 Secretary General Dr. Madhuri Patel; without them, I would 84 not be able to move forward. Thanks to Dr. P. Thank you to everyone who worked behind the scenes. Your love, affection, and support have enabled me to advance to positions of leadership in a variety of national and international organization, including ISAR, IAGE, IFFS, ASRM, ESHRE, and now FIGO and FOGSI.

Leadership is one of the most important aspects of suc-102 cess. It is primarily driven by Hierarchical collectivism. If 103 you want to successfully lead an organization, you must 104 have a hierarchy, which runs the organization in a collec-105 tive fashion. One must be inclusive, have continuity in ones 106 actions and consolidate what has been accomplished in the 107 past and present. Strategic planning for the future is very 108 important. I always tell people about the leadership mantras 109 that I have used in my career, and I best illustrate this by 110 giving examples of leaders from the past and present. The 111 most important mantra of leadership is passion. Kurt Semm 112 and Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam are good examples. I earned my 113 master's degree from Jones Institute at the age of 56; it was 114 difficult, but I was driven to succeed. Life has power, juice, 115 and meaning because of passion. Without passion, there is 116 no greatness. Passion drives people to stay up late and get up 117 early in order to be great. It was passion that drove a French 118 colposcopy doctor to remove the gall bladder through the 119 vagina. The second mantra of leadership is "Belief," with 120 Mahatma Gandhi and Elon Musk serving as prime exam-121 ples. The third mantra is Strategy. Alexander the Great was 122

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a fantastic strategist, as was our own General who won the 123 1971 Indo Pak war, Sam Manekshaw. The fourth mantra 124 is Clarity of values. This is very critical, and Swami Vive-125 kananda and Atal Bihari Vajpayee are wonderful examples 126 of this trait. The fifth mantra is Energy which is crucial, and 127 who better to showcase it than our current Prime Minister, 128 Shri Narendra Modi, as well as, our late Prime Minister Mrs 129 Indira Gandhi. The sixth mantra is Bonding power; Nelson 130 Mandela and Mahendra Singh Dhoni as great examples of 131 this. The seventh mantra is Communication, best represented 132 by Bill Clinton, Oprah Winfrey, and our own Dr Deepak 133 Chopra. I have added a few more mantras, one of which is 134 Loyalty. I will give my life rather than change my loyalty, 135 Indian Army is one such thing that is loyal to the nation. 136 Finally the most important mantra is having "Empathy and 137 Kindness" toward your patients and colleagues. Mother 138 Teresa is a good example of it. I feel that "If we can succeed 139 without hurting our colleagues, we can savour our success." 140 Being kind is the most important aspect of success to me,". 141 The great William Penn said, "I shall only pass through this 142 world once." So, whatever good I can do or kindness I can 143 show to any human being, let me do it now...because I will 144 AQ4 not pass this way again."

All of the above is implemented by Team FOGSI; obvi-146 ously, resources and a team are required to maintain and 147 grow this palace dedicated to women's health. FOGSI's 148 office bearers include Secretary General Dr. Madhuri Patel, 149 Incoming President Dr. Jaydeep Tank, and Vice Presidents 150 Dr. Alka Pandey, Dr. Asha Baxi, Dr. Geetendra Sharma, Dr. 151 Sampath Kumari, and Dr. Yashodhra Pradeep. They are sup-152 ported by Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar (deputy secretary general), 153 Dr. Parikshit Tank (treasurer), Dr. Niranjan Chavan (joint 154 treasurer), Dr. Manisha Takhtani (joint clinical secretary), 155 Dr. Laxmi Shirkhande (ICOG chair), and JOGI Editor, Dr. 156 Geetha Balsarkar. The 28 committee Chairs are my cabinet 157 minister, and they are very important to me. National coor-158 dinators, Zonal coordinators, Task Force, Youngistan, and 159 Volunteers have all been added. Dr. Rishma Pai and Dr. Nan-160 dita Palshetkar, both of whom are past presidents of FOGSI, 161 are my national coordinators. My zonal coordinators are 162 Drs. Ameya purandare, Komal Chavan, Rohan Palshetkar, 163 Shrutika Thakkar, Arnav Pai, Aparna, Anu chawla, Vinita 164 singh, Indarneel Datta, Jayrani Kamraj, and Selva Priya. I 165 have instituted new temporary groups called, the "Presiden-166 tial Task Force" and the "Youth Group,". Let us hope these 167 groups perform well, so that they can be continued by the 168 incoming president Dr. Jaydeep Tank. 169

I believe the federation has five important pillars namely:
academics, CSR, fellowship, advocacy, and research, Fellowship, I believe, is the thread that binds us all together.
In 1844, Alexander Duma published "Three Musketeers whose theme was "Omnes pro uno, Unus pro omnibus,"
which translates as "all for one, one for all." "Among the six

important things, I believe fellowship is a critical compo-176 nent of our organization. It is the foundation upon which the 177 entire organization is built. If you get a call at 2 a.m. in the 178 middle of the night asking for help and then run for helping 179 your friend, which is the power of fellowship. All work and 180 no play makes Jack obviously a dull boy, so fun filled fellow-181 ship is also very important, and we have many tools for that, 182 such as FOGSI's Talent 2.0, FOGSI luminary/achievers and 183 Appreciation Awards for leaders and members of FOGSI, 184 Ms/Mr. FOGSI Pageant, and FOGSI Sports Competition. Advocacy by FOGSI is one of the most critical pillars 186 of the association. When I returned to India in 1991, I was 187 traveling in Deccan Queen train, for delivering a talk at Pune 188 Gynecological Society's conference. I was sitting next to a 189 man, to whom I asked what doeshe do, to which he replied, 190 "I am a businessman." When he asked me about myself, I 191 said "I have just started a sperm bank and am going to give 192 a talk on the same subject, to the Pune society." To that, he 193 asked me, "What is the interest rate in your bank?" Though 194 amusing, such misconceptions must be dispelled. Hence, 195 advocacy amongst people, doctors and colleagues, using 196 community-based tools such as TV, radio, print, and social 197 media, and endorsements from doctors, politicians, celebri-198 ties, and civil society, is essential. 199

There will be four Zonal Conferences with Yuva at 200 Kota-Ranthambhore, Varanasi, Imphal and Calicut. There 201 are five academic conferences led by Vice Presidents at 202 Kodaikanal, Indore, Ahmedabad, Patna and Lucknow. 203 There are many specialty conferences and international 204 conferences as well. One of them being India Day, which 205 we started during Dr. Rishma Pai's tenure. We went to 206 the United Kingdom for India Day, and we are going to 207 repeat it on June 28, 2023. We hope that all of you will 208 come in large numbers. The other conference is FOGSI 209 FIGO Night and FIGO Conference in Paris in 2023, where 210 Dr. Anne Kihara will take over as President of FIGO. We 211 have also received many book proposals, the first of which 212 was released today. We also have planned to publish many 213 Good Clinical Practice Recommendations, nearly 30 in 214 total. The game changer is Digitalization-Platforms such 215 as Google and Facebook have enabled us to rapidly esca-216 late and do a variety of things that would have normally 217 required many physical meetings. We are also going to 218 plan many FOGSI Focuses as well. 219

Instead of telling people what they "need" to do, I asked 220 them what they "want" to do. The response has been over-221 whelming, with over 26 colleagues volunteering to help. 222 Integrated FOGSI CMEs will also be plentiful, as will 223 initiatives such as FOGSI Udaan Initiative USAID by Dr. 224 Jaydeep Tank, Prematurity Project SAMVEG USAID/ 225 IAP by Dr. Jaydeep Tank, FOGSI Initiative for Saving 226 the Uterus by Dr. Rishma Pai, FOGSI Initiative for Sav-227 ing the Ovary by Dr. Nandita Palshetkar, FOGSI Initiative 228

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for Reducing Maternal Mortality Rate by Dr. D K Dutta, 229 FOGSI Well Woman Initiative by Dr. Hema Divakar. 230 FOGSI Adult Vaccination initiative by Dr. Jayam Kan-231 nan, FOGSI NCD Project by Dr. Hrishikesh Pai, FOGSI 232 HDU Initiative by Dr. Alpesh Gandhi and FOGSI Youth 233 AQ6Endoscopy training by Dr. Prakash Trivedi/Dr. Alka Kriplani. One of the very crucial proposed initiatives is about 235 how to reduce caesarean birth, which I have reworded as 236 "FOGSI Initiative to Increase Safe and Respectful Vaginal 237 Birth" by Dr. Pratima Mittal/Dr Achla Batra." We also 238 have other initiatives such as FOGSI Youth Mela by Dr. 239 Suchitra Pandit, FOGSI Research Program by Dr. San-240 jay Gupte, FOGSI Advocacy on Social Media, Television 241 and Radio by Dr. Suvarna Khadilkar/Dr. Selvapriya Sar-242 vanan, FOGSI Celebration of Special Days and Health 243 Days by Dr. Priyankur Roy/Dr. Rohan Palshetkar/Dr. Anu 244 Chawla/Dr. Shrutika Thakkar, FOGSI Collaborations by 245 Dr. Maninder Ahuja, Plant One Tree for Every 1000 Births 246 initiative Dr. Kalyan Barmade, Cancer Cervix Prevention 247 by Dr. Niranjan Chavan, Promotion of Mental Health and 248 Well-being in Doctors and Patients by Dr. Parikshit Tank. 249 When Rishma and I had gone to Israel, a taxi driver told 250 us that there is one tree planted for every birth in Israel, 251 and a certificate is given to say that "This is your tree and 252 you shall take care of it," since Israel is a barren land and 253 trees are very important. So, I told Dr. Kalyan that we 254





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"CSR" is the most important aspect of my final presen-258 tation to you. My family was middle-class, and my father, 259 a professor, did not have much money. Since I wanted to 260 be a doctor, I had to study 18 h a day, and the State helped 261 me by paying for it. The State is responsible for my entire 262 career. No amount of charity will ever pay off the debt I 263 owe to my country. I am so grateful to my State and I want 264 to give back to the society. Mr. Om Prakash, a well-known 265 sand artist, will walk us through what I have planned for 266 the CSR. We are celebrating 75 years of independence 267 this year. We have made great strides: built roads, gone to 268 space, and so on. Two hundred crore COVID vaccinations 269 have been administered, and there have been numerous 270 other developments. FOGSI, an organization of 37,000 271 gynecologists, is working on this to improve women's 272 health in its 61st year. Swasth Nari and Sukhi Nari are 273 the FOGSI theme for this year. Badlaav's CSR campaign 274 is defined by Ekikaran-Integration, Samanta-Equality, 275 Takniki-Technology. Badlaav initiative areas include: 276 teen and adult vaccination programs, gender equality and 277 women's empowerment, improved and respectful mater-278 nity care (Manyata), sexual and reproductive health (con-279 traception and family planning), preventive health check-280 ups for women, anemia prevention, NCDs for non-pregnant 281 women, cancer prevention and treatment, mental health, 282 mid-life and menopause. Eighteenth of every month, many 283 volunteers at our Badlaav Clinics will perform free health 284 checks on non-pregnant women in their consulting room. 285 During my tenure as Secretary General of the Federation 286 in 2016, FOGSI along with Indian Medical association, 287

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launched the Pradhan Mantri Surkhashit Matriv Abhiyan 288 (PMSMA) on the 9th of every month. I wish to establish 289 this Badlaav as a Pradhan Mantri Badlaav Program, on 290 18th of every month. I am hoping that this can happen. 291 The logo image depicts multiple languages as well as the 292 colors pink and green for health and yellow for happiness. 293 The Nari Swasthya Janandolan Yatra is one of the starting 294 points and an important part of this Badlaav campaign. 295 The Na Na Anemia Bus Yatra by Procter and Gamble, as 296
